COMING BACK FROM THE EDGE

Fourteen years ago I was a basket case. I literally drank myself sober after 3 decades of binge drinking. My bottom was one of unbearable emotional pain, torment and a distorted sense of reality. God is said to help fools and alcoholics – I was both.

While praying from a pamphlet called "Acceptance", I was transformed into a state of euphoria and peace, the likes of which I had never experienced. The feeling is hard to explain because it was so surreal. My body felt as if it was levitating over the bed. This spiritual experience could have lasted for 10 seconds or 10 minutes. I'll never know, but it was enough to give me hope that I would be okay if I kept praying and embraced certain principles.

The first step was surrendering and accepting that I was powerless over alcohol and my life had become unmanageable and unbearable.

My first experience with A.A. was several years before. I remember picking up a 6 year medallion & six months later taking a drink that lasted for 3 ½ years. Mentally I drank much earlier. Those first 6 ½ years are what I call Raving Mad Sobriety. When I made a decision to have just one drink to celebrate the marvelous length of sobriety I had accumulated, in truth, I did nothing to deserve Sobriety. The demons were still within & there was no spiritual force to cast them out. That 2nd white chip I picked up on October 5th, 1997 was the start of a journey of recovery that at times was similar to a roller coaster ride. Some days were high, some low, but I never gave up. Some days I took 2 steps backwards, other days-3 steps forward. Always with hope, then faith in a power other than my own that would carry the load if it got too heavy.

Today that faith has turned into knowing my spiritual power is there every day if I stay connected to Him by prayer and meditation. There is no greater satisfaction than to help another alcoholic when he asks for help. I have been fortunate to experience that feeling more than once during the last 14 years and what should be on my tombstone is "that I was able to help another alcoholic through the power and will of God." My three sponsors were there exactly when I needed them-a miracle considering my life before A.A. was one of unsuccessfully trying to help myself and keeping my own council.

I've learned to practice being silent, still and listening for God's directions.

I've learned that if I don't drink, I won't get drunk.

I've learned that alcoholism is a physical allergy and a mental obsession.

I've learned that I can never pick up that first drink.

I've learned that to keep what I have, I must give it away to other alcoholics.

I've learned that to keep what I have, I must give it away to other alcoholics.

I've learned that the program of A.A. is one part of God acknowledgement, one part self actualization and one part fellowship.

I've learned that I must never stop learning the language of recovery.

THE STEPS & THE TRADITIONS

STEP 1 ~ "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable." TRADITION 1 ~ "Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon AA unity."

And now for.... "Who's Fault?" from the Akron Intergroup

Who's Fault?

There is a tide of unrest and apathy rising in our Program of recovery from alcoholism. Singleness of purpose has become a bone of contention, as has having a sponsor and working the Steps of recovery.

Non-alcoholics speak of their rights, yet fail to acknowledge that not being members of AA they have no rights.

I have always believed in and based my recovery from alcoholism on the Program developed by the first 100 members and written down in our Big Book.

As we grow further apart from those first 100, those who contributed to the writing of our Big Book, we allow their teachings to fade into antiquity. Like impudent children we have come to believe that we know better than those who came before us. We mock our own history, as if that history was all a lie. We forget what was written at great expense, and we stumble and sometimes fall over things that are identified in our book.

I have heard newcomers being told from the podium that there is no need for a sponsor or to work our Steps, forget all the tools that are in our AA books, do whatever you want and believe what you will. Just go to meetings and don't drink and all will be well.

There for many younger members, and may not be here at all within the next decade. We may end up with something called AA, but it will be addictions anonymous, and many an alcoholic will then walk down a dark alley looking for the light of recovery. The light will have gone out.

Whose fault is it that our recovery rate is no longer even 50%? Whose fault is it that the mere mention of singleness of purpose brings forth anger and resentment in our meetings? Whose fault is it that what little sponsorship we have, has for the most part fallen silent?

Whose fault? Each and every one of us who believes what is written in our Big Book yet sits mute in the face of its destruction.
