Memories of Past Alcathons at Central House

Jack with one day sober: It happened 6 years ago outside the old Central House on Gulfstream. I was waiting for my home group's Alcathon meeting to begin. Off in the distance, not too far away from the café, I saw a guy with that, "I'm new and all alone, and don't know whether I want to be here" look. He wasn't in the greatest of shape.

I walked over, put out my hand, and introduced myself. He told me he had his last drink earlier that day...that his wife was in a treatment center over the holidays...and he decided he might want to do something about his drinking. We talked for a while. He wasn't sure whether he wanted to come in. I invited him to sit with some of the guys from my home group. He stayed for the meeting, and for a while after.

I did this, because I remembered, and will always remember, my first day at the Delray Club in Bethesda. *Yes, there is a Delray Club in Maryland!* Just out of detox, I took the long walk to my first meeting. The Club was in an old warehouse. No one stood outside smoking. There seemed to be a "mile long" hallway down which I had to walk into my first meeting. I was lonely, humiliated, and scared.

Jack was standing near the meeting room door. He stuck out his hand, introduced himself, took me into the meeting room, got me a cup of coffee, and sat next to me. After the meeting, I learned that Jack's sponsor "suggested" he find a newcomer because Jack had been sober 1 day!

Jack made me feel welcome. I looked forward to seeing him. We had coffee a couple times, sharing our experience and hope, with a tiny bit of strength. I left the Delray Club for Florida not long after. I don't know if Jack's still sober, but he changed my life. When I saw the "new guy" at Central House, I thought of Jack.

A year+ passed. I was at a meeting in Boca I very seldom attend. It was anniversary night. A guy came up to me, gave me a hug, and asked if I would present his 1st year medallion. I didn't recognize him at first. Well, he was the guy I welcomed at the Alcathon a year earlier.

It was difficult for me to present his medallion because I was choked up. I just ran into him this November, and gratefully he's still sober. This and many occurrences like it constantly remind me of my responsibility. While it is a "we" program, "I am responsible" to reach out, to welcome the newcomer.

Detoxing at Central House: Two years ago, I was coming to the current Delray Central House for an Alcathon meeting. I saw a lady friend from my home group sitting with another group member who had gone out for more research and development, and was in terrible shape. She had been released from a hospital earlier that day and was brought to a detox. But her blood alcohol level was too high and they asked her to come back. So my friend brought her to Central House to sit, detox, shakily drink some coffee, and eat some food. I sat with them for about 3 hours, until they left for detox. The next day I learned when they went to

detox her blood alcohol was still too high. So my friend sat with her for the next 36 hours. She finally made it into detox, signed herself out about 2 days later, and stayed drunk for 6 more months. When she finally reached her new hell of a bottom, she asked for help. Her friend's now her sponsor and she has almost 2 years. What I didn't tell you was that my friend gave up 2 days with her family, including many from out of town, to sit with and love a fellow drunk. She was responsible.

If you don't give back, then you're stealing from AA: I was at an anniversary meeting at a group in Boynton Beach. One lady presented her sponsor with her 10 year medallion. She mentioned many things her sponsor told her in early sobriety. One of the things she said really hit home. The now double digit lady told her sponsee that "if she was not giving back, then she was stealing from AA." She said, "If you just come to AA and sit in meetings, don't get involved in a home group, and don't help other alcoholics, then you're simply a taker – and that's stealing from AA."

So at this year's Alcathon...at your home group...at any meeting... reach out and welcome newcomers including: a newcomer that might be newly sober (or still a little drunk); a person who just moved into the area and feels like a newcomer; or a person at their first "voluntary non-based" AA meeting. Whatever the case, I know I am definitely responsible to give back what was freely given to me. How about you?

1 Line up extra A.A. activities for the holiday season. Arrange to take newcomers to meetings, answer the phones at a clubhouse or central office, speak, help with dishes, or visit the alcoholic ward at a hospital.



2 Be host to A.A. friends, especially newcomers. If you don't have a place where you can throw a formal party, take one person to a diner and spring for the coffee.



3 Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge or panic comes—postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.



4 Find out about the special holiday parties, meetings, or other celebrations

given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.



5 Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.



6 If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.



7 Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.



8 Worship in your own way.



9 Don't sit around brooding. Catch up on those books, museums, walks, and letters.



10 Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember—"one day at a time."



11 Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts—but this year, you can give love.



12 "Having had a . . ." No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.
