

HUMILITY

One of the greatest challenges in ongoing sobriety is to repeatedly confront the same character defects over and over again. Or, more accurately, the consequences of those same character defects — especially if you have really tried to address them via the tools offered in Alcoholics Anonymous.

It has been my experience (my painful, embarrassing, experience, actually) whenever I am in that place again, that my real problem is twofold:

The first is that I am looking at the result and not the process. In other words, it is easy to want to have money in the bank, but where I need to my Higher Power's help is in spending differently. It is easy to want to get to work on time, but the focus should be on the willingness to go to sleep at a decent hour and get up at a realistic time to actually get ready and go. It's easy to want a different body, it's hard to be willing to eat differently or become disciplined about exercise.

My character defect is really not in the *result*, i.e. the bank balance, the tardiness or the numbers on the scale ... my character defect is to be found somewhere in the *process*.

The second thing — and somehow I have found that although, logically, it doesn't appear related to the above, it actually is in powerful and unfathomable ways — if I'm applying the principles and ideas from the 12 Steps to these things, the main point of the 7th, is "Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings." is about humility — *not the shortcomings*. Not the defects.

I need a constant reminder of this, since, in certain areas I keep trying to make it about the problem, and not about a spiritual solution — which I reach via humility.

Frankly, on some days it seems like this whole deal would be a lot easier if we could just scrap this "humility" thing altogether.

But apparently, some people have tried that.

From what I understand, they can be found down at the bar.

SEVENTH TRADITION

"Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

When I stopped drinking, I assumed the world was going to pat me on the back. At the least, was not I worth a little monetary handout? For being sober? For saving taxpayers the money it would have taken to lock me up for many years? A little reward from you for my being such a caring, sharing, newly sober member of—what was that again? Alcoholics Anonymous? Holy Smokes! That sounded serious!

And it was! It was so serious that I'm still here, still sober, many 24 hours after. I have not killed myself, nor anyone else yet. But, IF someone had handed me a few bucks, I'd have taken it as an omen—to begin again that "one last fling" at pretending to be someone other than me. Nothing wrong here, just give me a dinner, give me a bed, give me shelter, comfort, a little credit, security...gimme, gimme, gimme. Well, 'Nobody' coughed up the loot. Thank you, 'Nobody'! You also saved my life, 'Nobody'.

It was and is so with our groups. Once my group accepts donations from an individual, business, philanthropy, or (shudder) government, we are beholden to somebody, somewhere, somehow. There is no escape from that axiom.

And where then goes the "God in charge of my group", Who meets with us in group conscience? Where goes our autonomy as is promised in Tradition Two? Where goes our justifiable JOY of having breached the walls built between each of us and God?

Our (my) independence shall not become dependence. And 'dependent'—that's where I've been all my drinking years. Now, I have a piece of my mind back, along with 'peace of mind'—and that certain independence called free will.

The whole group-decision process, the carefully guarded quality of self-governance we cherish, would be in dire jeopardy if it were not for our Traditions. We are kept safe from ourselves (and others!) by virtue of strict observance of our beautiful Traditions.

Oh, something else. I've got to say this. In the beginning I was told that if all I had was a little loose change...do not put it in the basket. If that is all I have, AA does not want, nor need it. A dollar was customary years ago. A dollar is no longer what it used to be. A pack of cigarettes probably costs at least \$6 by now. A couple bucks is the (basket) norm today. My gosh how much does a bottle of beer cost now? (I have not a clue.) Of course, this IS a private matter, *but I had to bring up that we ARE self-supporting, even with no dues or fees!* And coffee isn't getting any cheaper.

I can also—if I'm broke or not!—make coffee, do dishes, set up the room, wipe off tables and chairs, empty trash, sweep, mop, paint, be a greeter and meet everyone who comes in the door. this all comes under the heading "self-supporting"...

One more thing. It is the practice of my sponsor, and adopted by me, that I neither lender nor borrower be. When, on rare occasion, I'm inspired to put some cash in someone's pocket, it is never intended as a loan. It is strictly a gift. That way, there is never hard feelings, misunderstandings, or problems, resulting from a necessary exchange of some bucks, now and then.

However, I frequently buy an A.A.-type book, or a special meditation book for another...and always, always it is with the sure knowledge that one day he will pass it forward to another.

Please do realize that A.A. in no way has anything to do with my own observations and opinions. Thank you for understanding this.

Even after the riskiness of writing my private thoughts on Tradition Seven...

I still LOVE you ALL. Believe that!

What is an Intergroup Rep?

An Intergroup Representative is the link between your Home Group and the local Intergroup Office, which handles our local 12th Step work. This is entirely separate from your General Service Rep who is the link to Area General Service and A.A.'s worldwide affairs.

The local A.A. Intergroup handles local services only, and involves Partnership among A.A. Groups in a community. An Intergroup office exists to carry out certain functions common to all Groups – functions which are best handled by a centralized office – and is supported by these Groups. As an Intergroup Rep you will share the needs of the local committees and Intergroup office with your Home Group, so we can carry on better 12th Step work in our communities. Intergroup Reps attend the monthly Intergroup Business Meeting representing their Group Conscience, and make motions based upon their Home Group Conscience for the Intergroup to consider.

An Intergroup Rep, if qualified, may choose to stand for a Committee Chair position or Officer position; or become a member of our Standing Committees and Special Event Committees as needed.

It is recommended that all elected Trusted Servants read the A.A. Service Manual and understand the Twelve Concepts of Service, our 3rd Legacy of Alcoholics Anonymous.
